

5 Lambruscos Worth a Second Sip

Cleto Chiarli Lambrusco di Sorbara Fondatore NV



Cleto Chiarli has been producing Lambrusco in the Emilia-Romagna region since 1860, and its breadth of experience is unmistakable in this exceptional wine. Traditional in-bottle fermentation (*metodo ancestrale*) is followed by six months of aging that imparts an effervescent froth. Fondatore is light in color and quite fragrant, as is often the case with Sorbara, one of three major varieties of Lambrusco grape, along with Salamino and Grasparossa. This is a dry and savory Lambrusco that stakes out the choice middle ground between fruitiness and lip-smacking tang.
